I hope that you have attended at least one event and enjoyed it. Wellness can be achieved in many different ways: physical activity, socializing, relaxing, family bonding... lots of good ways! Also, be sure to sign up for NIXLE alerts (go to <u>www.NIXLE.com</u> and enter your zip code). This service is not

meant to bombard anyone with event reminders, but mainly to send important messages and alerts... such as weather alerts, trash or recycling issues (an emerging problem due to the nationwide shortage of truck drivers, caused by the ever-increasing demand for deliveries of all sorts), etc. The Township, including



the Police and Public Works departments, utilizes this tool for communication.

The Township building has installed numerous upgrades to conform to safety measures for the building, not only for our township employees, but also to be fully and safely open to residents and customers. Most of these projects have been funded by federal CARES Act monies! We received \$123,389 for the work!

We have new businesses starting to break ground in town. The **Exeter** warehouse has started 'earthing the grounds' to prepare to build. Did you know Exeter will bring in not just jobs but also tax revenue to Edgewater Park. It is important to squash any ideas there is a tax abatement for that building! Also, **Curaleaf** has been fine tuning their building plans and anticipates a June opening. There are current construction plans for the new **Weimann Building**. Based on some of the (new) usages of the building, the Township received two grants totaling \$725,000 to remodel this building into a **Community Center** and for its usage as a **County Nutrition Center**. As the Weimann blueprints are finalized, there are plans on the table for a much-needed new police station.

Maybe the biggest, longest-awaited announcement is the new business deal for the old PathMark building. But you will have to wait a little while longer to hear what it is (from me), although maybe, if you comb through social media, you know. Despite not being finalized (at the time that I write this**) I just don't want to jinx it! Also, new housing is being built along Route 130 and Hoover has been revitalizing the Plaza.



Using open space funds, a surprise will make its appearance at the Weimann complex for the little ones, though maybe the bigger surprise was for the soccer teams to see the soccer wall was taken down. Like I said... so much to just pick one thing!

Can't wait to see these projects come into fruition, plus what else may come our way, with the benefit, of course, of the revenues from these projects!
