Please be patient and know the Police Department understands the feelings of the public and cares about our residents. But this is a logistical process. BTW, here is a fun fact about our current police department: just about all our officers either grew up in Edgewater Park or either currently or have lived in EP at some point of their career. This is their stomping ground. They have family in town. In most respects, this is their town, too. So please take comfort in knowing that they care about this community and YOU, because it is their community, too!

2. The Public Works Department. The snow in February was a bit much, literally! But the crew was out at all hours over the course of three days to clear our streets during the nor'easter early February. Kudos to the work with all the snow! Please understand, however, that they can't get to every street first and often must go back again. There are logistics to snow plowing and laying salt, and it's a process. I know people don't like shoveling out a driveway and sidewalks more than once, but sometimes it happens that way because that's where the plowed snow needs to go. Please always reach out directly if there is a problem and you need assistance. Best thing you can do to help... please remove your car from the street before a snow event: 1) There is an ordinance that requires you do so, 2) Public Works can't do its best work when having to navigate around cars in the street, 3) It's a hazard and your car can get hit by anyone driving down the street. On another note, I will also mention that half our Public Works crew also have personal ties to Edgewater Park, including our Supervisor who has resided in EP for about 20 years!
