Dear Residents,

Our 2022 school year has begun! The traffic on Cherrix Ave has been very heavy during drop-off and pick-up times. We are working on a solution to the issue to relieve some pressure on Cherrix.

In the meantime, I ask that you drive cautiously, watch for the children crossing the street, pay attention to the crossing guards, respect the other drivers on the road and respect the residents that live near the school. Do not block driveways, fire hydrants or park in the areas marked "no parking" by yellow curbing and or signage. Our officers will be looking out for the violators and summonses will be issued for the infraction.

We would like to remind our residents of important parking restrictions within the Township and the State that have become a problem recently.

Please see the statutes below as they will be enforced by the Police Department.

### 39:4-138 "NO PARKING" is permitted:

- a. within an intersection.
- b. on a crosswalk.
- c. in front of a public or private driveway.
- d. (1) within 25 feet of the nearest crosswalk.
- e. on a sidewalk.
- f. in any approved "No Parking" space.
- g. within 50 feet of a stop sign.
- h. within 10 feet of a fire hydrant.
- i. within 50 feet of a railroad crossing.

#### 39:4-135 "No Parking in the wrong direction on a two-way roadway"

"The operator of a motor vehicle shall not stop, stand or park the vehicle in a roadway other than parallel with the edge of the roadway headed in the direction of traffic, on the right-hand side of the road and with the curb side of the vehicle within six inches of the edge of the roadway, except as follows:

a. upon one-way streets, local authorities may permit parking of vehicles parallel with the left-hand edge of the roadway headed in the direction of traffic, on the left-hand side of the road and with the curb side of the vehicle within six inches of the edge of the roadway."

This means when parking parallel to a curb, your passenger side door must be facing the curb in the direction of traffic. This also applies to parking in a cul-de-sac.

#### **Local Ordinances:**

- #490-13 A No commercial truck parking in a residential area in excess of one hour. (10,000 lbs. or more)
- #490-13 B No truck parking in residential area with GVW of 10,000 lbs. or more.
- #490-13 C No Commercial Truck Parking on private property without written permission by property owner displayed in windshield.
