Report from the Township Engineer

Mt. Holly Road

Mr. Darji advised that the final costs for the Mt. Holly Road Project will be presented at the next meeting and will go out for bid after the DEP sewer approval.

Mr. McElwee asked if the new base will withstand truck traffic.

Mr. Darji advised that the base under the paving will withstand up to 400 psi.

On-Call

Mr. Darji discussed the On-Call work that needs to be started. Township Committee suggested that they adopt a resolution at the next meeting to authorize the On-Call work.

Bids: Buckno, Weimann, Public Works Utility Building

Mr. Darji informed Township Committee that the following projects are coming up for bid:

1. The former Buckno property demolition bids next week and the award is anticipated to be at the second meeting in April.
2. The Weimann Project bid is next week. This will include alternates for the Municipal Building and driveway paving. He hopes to award in May and pave in July or August.
3. The Public Works Utility Building will also bid next week. ERI will review the gas supply.

Report from Municipal Clerk/Administrator

Winter Storm Jonas

Mrs. Dougherty informed Township Committee that winter storm Jonas which occurred on January 22 -24, 2016 was declared an emergency by FEMA today, making the township costs associated with the storm eligible for FEMA funds.

NJ SEM

Mrs. Dougherty advised Township Committee that the Township has participated in the electric supply auction but not the gas (commodity market) and asked committee if they were interested in the gas portion.

Township Committee discussed that due to market fluctuations and instability that the Township should opt out of the gas portion. Consensus of Township Committee was to opt out of the gas portion.

Environmental Advisory

Mrs. Dougherty spoke to Township Committee about the ANJEC requirements that necessitate the Environmental Advisory Committee to be done by ordinance instead of a yearly resolution. This will make the Environmental Committee eligible to be able for grant funding. The ordinance will be introduced at the April 5th Meeting and adopted at the April 19th meeting. Consensus of Township Committee was to rename the committee to the Environmental Shade Tree Advisory Committee.

Elcon

Mr. Belgard and Mrs. Dougherty attended Elcon Recycling Services, LLC informational meeting on February 23, 2016 in Langhorne PA. The Elcon Recycling project that is proposed for a location along the Delaware River in PA has passed the Phase 1-Part A application; residents should become informed about the proposal and participate in the town meetings.

Arthur Drive

Mr. Darji advised that the lining of the pipes that is needed on Arthur Drive would be approximately \$650,000. If we were to use the County Shared Services contractor, he estimates it would come in just under \$1 million.

Supporting Bill A4763/S2973

Electronic Waste Management Act

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Township Committee of the Township of Edgewater Park that it does hereby support the passage of A4763/S2973, Electronic Waste Management Act; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a certified copy of this resolution shall be distributed to the Governor of the State of New Jersey, Edgewater Park's Senate and Assembly representatives, the NJ League of Municipalities, the Burlington County Board of Chosen Freeholders and the local municipalities within the County of Burlington.

Resolution of the Township of Edgewater Park Opposing the Application of Waste Management Submitted to the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection Agency for a Proposed Landfill to be Located in Fairless Hills, Pennsylvania

WHEREAS, the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection Agency has received an application form Waste Management which would allow for the construction of a solid waste landfill on a part of the old Fairless Steel Site, located in Fairless Hills, Bucks County, Pennsylvania; and

WHEREAS, given the prevailing winds out of the west, the location of this facility will undoubtedly have a direct impact on the residents of the Township of Edgewater Park and other surrounding communities; and

WHEREAS, there has been documented evidence filed by the residents of our neighboring town, Florence Township, wherein those residents recently won a grassroots battle against Waste Management with regards to Tullytown Landfill. The Florence Township residents' complaints date back 20 years with the main complaints being the foul odors and seagull issues; and

WHEREAS, it is the duty of the Township Committee of the Township of Edgewater Park to represent and protect the interests, health and quality of life of the residents of the Township of Edgewater Park; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Township Committee of the Township of Edgewater Park, County of Burlington, State of New Jersey, that it does hereby oppose the construction of this landfill and further urges the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection Agency to consider the negative impact that the proposed landfill would have on the residents of Burlington County; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Township Clerk is hereby directed to forward a certified copy of this resolution to the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection Agency; Burlington County Municipal Clerks; and the Burlington County Board of Chosen Freeholders.

WHEREAS, according to the Clean Air Council, Elcon has applied to receive 596 different kinds of waste, producing 800 tons of hazardous sludge per year and 5,000 tons of hazardous salts; and

WHEREAS, given the prevailing winds out of the west, the location of this facility will undoubtedly have a direct impact on the residents of the Township of Edgewater Park and other surrounding communities; and

WHEREAS, it is the duty of the Township Committee of the Township of Edgewater Park to represent and protect the interests, health and quality of life of the residents of the Township of Edgewater Park; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Township Committee of the Township of Edgewater Park, County of Burlington, State of New Jersey, that it does hereby oppose the construction of this facility and further urges the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection Agency to consider the negative impact that the proposed hazardous “thermal oxidizer” facility would have on the residents of Burlington County; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Township Clerk is hereby directed to forward a certified copy of this resolution to the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection Agency; Burlington County Municipal Clerks; and the Burlington County Board of Chosen Freeholders.

ORDINANCE NO. 2016-1 (FIRST READING)

***AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF EDGEWATER PARK,
COUNTY OF BURLINGTON, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, AMENDING
CHAPTER 5.20 EDGEWATER PARK TOWNSHIP MUNICIPAL CODE ENTITLED
“MOTOR VEHICLE WRECKERS”***

WHEREAS, the Township Committee of the Township of Edgewater Park has determined that there is a need to amend the established schedule of towing and storage services based on the usual, customary, and reasonable rates of operator, towing and storing motor vehicles in the Township of Edgewater Park and County of Burlington, which it will require all Edgewater park wreckers to adhere to.

WHEREAS, Township Committee wishes to amend Chapter 5.20 established by Ordinance No. 10-98, adopted September 16, 1998 and Amended per Ordinance No. 5-2007 adopted June 7, 2007 and further amending Ordinance No. 2012 Section 20.490 adopted February 7, 2012.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Township Committee of the Township of Edgewater Park, County of Burlington, and State of New Jersey, that the Township Code of the Township of Edgewater Park is hereby amended as follows:

SECTION ONE: SECTION 5.20.020E Is Hereby Repealed And Replaced With The Following:

ORDINANCE NO. 5-2007

5.20.020E. In its contract with the Township, the wrecker will instances where flatbed, towing/winching, labor and cleanup cost and storage of motor vehicles is being provided without the consent of the owner of said vehicle, automobiles, motorcycles, motor scooters, mopeds, and trucks agree to charge for basic towing and storage services rates identical to the following model:

ORDINANCE NO. 2012-1

Section 20.490

1. Basic Fees under 5 tons (Monday through Friday)
 - A. During the hours of 8:00 am to 5:00pm - \$115.00 plus \$10.00 for mileage.
 - B. During the hours of 5:00pm to 8:00am - \$130.00 plus \$10.00 for mileage.
2. Saturday, Sunday, and Holidays Service Fees
 - A. \$130.00 plus \$10.00 mileage.
 - B. Holidays recognized by the Township of Edgewater Park for purposes of this chapter shall be New Year's Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving, and Christmas Day.
3. Fees for trucks five (5) tons to ten (10) tons \$180.00
4. Fees for trucks over ten (10) tons, buses, tractor trailers, heavy equipment: \$240.00
5. Winching service is any operation in which a vehicles is moved onto a roadway, from a position off the roadway or any other operation whereby a vehicles is moved by the use of a cable from a position that is not accessible for a direct hookup by conventional means for leading onto a tow vehicle. "Winching" is not pulling a vehicle onto a tilt bed carrier or lifting a motor vehicle with a conventional tow sling. Winching service is not associated with towing of the vehicle, which shall be permitted only if the vehicle is not operational and it must be towed from the lot or it is in an accident and there is additional winching.
 - A. Light winching (under 10 tons) - \$125.00 per unit per hour.
 - B. Medium winching (10 tons to 25 tons) - \$150,00 per unit per hour
 - C. Heaving winching (over 25 tons) - \$225.00 per unit per hour.
6. Storage Fees
 - A. Inside Storage - \$35.00 per day.
 - B. Outside Storage - \$25.00 per day.
 - C. Trucks 5 tons to 10 tons will be charged \$45.00 per day
 - D. Trucks, tractors trailers, buses and heavy equipment over 10 tons, \$50.00 per day

- E. With regard to storage pursuant to subsections (A) through (D) above, there will be a minimum charge of one day storage. There will be no charge for storage for Sunday if the tower elects not to have business hours on Sunday provided that the vehicle be removed by close of business on Monday
 - F. Fees paid to operators by municipalities for storage of removed motor vehicles; will be consistent with N.J.S.A. 40:48-2.50 and shall not exceed the following:
 - 1. A limit of \$3.00 per day for the first 30 days of storage per vehicle.
 - 2. A limit of \$2.00 per day for the 31st day of storage and any day thereafter.
 - 3. A limit of \$400.00 per vehicle stored regardless of the duration of the storage, except that a waiver may be granted for good cause upon the request of a municipality by the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs.
7. Other fees
- A. Fluid clean-up material (ex. oil dry) fee shall be \$12.00 per bag.
 - B. Vehicle lock-out fee shall be \$60.00
 - C. Jump start service fee shall be \$60.00
 - D. Tire change fee shall be \$75.00 per tire
 - E. Out of fuel service fee shall be \$60.00 plus the cost of fuel
8. There shall be no gate fees, administrative fees, mileage fees fuel fees, or any other fees charged by the tow company operating pursuant to this chapter, the above-cited fees are the only fees that may lawfully be charge.

The contract will be available to the public for inspection during the normal business hours of the municipal clerk's office.

SECTION TWO: All ordinances and provisions thereof inconsistent with the Provisions of this Ordinance shall be and are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

SECTION THREE: If any section, paragraph, subdivision, clause or provisions of this Ordinance shall be adjudged invalid, such adjudication shall apply only to the section, paragraph, subdivision, clause or provision and the remainder of this ordinance shall be deemed valid and effective.

The foregoing ordinance will be consider for adoption of final reading after the public hearing to be held on April 5, 2016 at 7:00 PM, or shortly thereafter, and place to which such meeting may be adjourned, in the Municipal Building, 400 Delanco Road, Edgewater Park, New Jersey. At which time and place all persons interested will be given an opportunity to be heard concerning said Ordinance. During the week prior to and up to and including the date of such meeting, copies of said ordinance will be made available at the Clerk's office to the members of the general public who shall request the same.

Elcon

Mr. Belgard advised that the Elcon Project was defeated at the prior location and is being opposed at the new location. The proximity to the river is too close for the 100 year storm lines. He further advised that the material that is to be trucked through the area is not safe and will increase the truck traffic on all roads including those in New Jersey that lead to the facility.

Mr. McElwee advised that the Sewerage Authority met last week and their audit is complete with minor comments.

Mrs. Perkins – Liaison to Recreation, Environmental Advisory

Environmental Advisory Committee

Mrs. Perkins advised that the Environmental Advisory Committee met last week. They resubmitted the 5 year plan and it was approved. She advised that their next meeting will be April 19th.

Mayor Trainor – Liaison to EPAA and Redevelopment Committee

Mayor Trainor advised that one of the objectives this year will be upgrading the website.

Redevelopment Committee

Mayor Trainor reported that the Redevelopment Committee did not meet in February.

EPAA

Mayor Trainor reported that EPAA met last week. There was an overwhelming spring soccer turn out with over 150 registrations and that registration is now closed. The Soccer program now encompasses Mommy & Me (for 5 and under) through U14. All spring soccer will be held at Memorial Field.

Mayor Trainor advised that Baseball registration is now closed and is down this year.

Mayor Trainor discussed that the Flag Football registration will be open through Thursday for in person registration and online registration will close this weekend.

Mayor Trainor reported that the Basketball semifinals and championships are this week.

He advised that the EPAA meetings are held the 2nd Tuesday of the Month at 7:30 PM at 45th Street Pub.

OPEN TO THE PUBLIC

Dennis Robbins - 9 Crystal Dr.

Mr. Robbins reported to township committee that the fire commissioners' reorganization will be at their 1st meeting in March. The combining of commissions and emergency services needs to be addressed.

Mr. Robbins advised that there is a petition circulating to have the township open its doors 5 days a week. He believed that they only needed signatures of 10% of those that voted in the last general election to get the question on the ballot in November.

Dominic Troisi - 426 Taylor Court

Mr. Troisi asked why there was a need to go to 5 days a week instead of the 4 days.

Mayor Trainor advised that there were two different thought processes in town. One was that the offices should be open for 5 days with less hours per day while others think that the current schedule of 4 days with longer hours works.

Mayor Trainor further said that other townships that are open 5 days do not offer all of their services on all days and only offer specific services on specific days and times. He gave the example of only being able to obtain permits on Monday, Wednesdays and Fridays from 9-12 in some townships. Our offices are open for all services during the hours of operation on all 4 days. He also said that the office is currently offering late hours twice a month on the 2nd and 4th Wednesdays from 10 AM to 6:30 PM.

Mayor Trainor said that if a Petition is presented to be put on the ballot in the fall, he was advised that it will be a non-binding referendum question and will require the accounting firm to do a cost analysis of how much additional it would be to open the extra day.

Mr. Malecki advised that there are open space grants available to make guides and maps showing our parks; approximately \$1,500.00 grant funding is available.
