The Committee has since combined functions with the Environmental Commission and with the Open Space Committee.

It is the focus of the Environmental/Shade Tree Commission to help establish means by which to beautify and enhance the environment of Edgewater Park.

Commission Goals

- 1 To cohesively plan a common thread and appearance for the parks and open spaces throughout Edgewater Park
- 1 To refurbish and create a plan for the redevelopment of Roosevelt Park and the Delaware River Heritage Trail
 - 1 To plan for the beautification of main entrances and focal points
 - 1 To assist residents in the selection and planning of appropriate plantings on their property
 - 1 To review the landscape plans and environmental impacts of proposed projects in conjunction with the Planning Board


